#### Service Dogs

A guide dog, hearing dog or assistance dog is specially trained to perform specific physical tasks and behaviours to assist a person with a disability and reduce their need for support to promote independence for the person to participate in the community.

The Guide, Hearing and Assistance Dogs Act 2009 (the Act) came into effect on 1 July 2009. The Act ensures that every person who relies on a certified guide, hearing or assistance dog has the same access rights as others to public places and public passenger vehicles.

Dogs must be certified and be able to pass a Public Access Test to ensure they are safe and effective in a public place, public passenger vehicle, or place of accommodation, and are able to be controlled by the handler/s in all situations.

Certified dogs can be almost any breed and will be easily recognised by the badge on their coat or harness.

Handlers accompanied by a certified dog, as well as trainers, are required to carry a handler's identity card.

A guide, hearing or assistance dog is not a pet or a 'companion' dog. Most people are familiar with the guide dogs used by people with a vision impairment. However, there are many other dogs that assist people with a disability in their day-to-day activities, including dogs that:

- alert people with a hearing impairment to a sound (hearing dog)
- pull wheelchairs, carry and pick up items, or help people with mobility impairments, or alert and support people with medical conditions or psychiatric disorders when experiencing 'at risk' situations (assistance dogs)

Under the Act, handler(s) and their certified dog have access rights to public places (such as restaurants and shops), public passenger vehicles (such as trains or taxis used to transport members of the public), and places of accommodation (such as hotels and campgrounds).



It is unlawful under the Anti-Discrimination Act 1991 (Qld) to discriminate by refusing entry or access to a public place because a person relies on a guide, hearing or assistance dog.

## "Show Model Rules" Taskforce - Expressions of interest

An initiative of Qld Ag Shows to create a constitution which can be used by shows and sub chambers is about to begin. The aim is to provide a "standard" Show Constitution that shows might be able to adopt as a "Show Model Rules" which would be show specific and address some of the difficulties that shows were having.

A taskforce committee of comprising of 7 members is to be set up of both internal and external representatives to help create a "show model rules".

An expression of interest has been sent to shows and sub chambers. Applications close 14<sup>th</sup> April and it is anticipated that they can begin work by the end of April to have it completed later this year. The meetings of the group will be conducted by ZOOM and email with no intention to meet in person.

#### Quilts across Queensland

Quilts that win a First prize at an affiliated show are eligible to enter the Quilts across Qld competition at the EKKA.

Class 11 Open - Representative Quilt submitted by an Affiliated Show Society Entries must be submitted by and under the name of the nominating Show Society. Quilts entered must be 'Best of Show' or equivalent from the most recent show and only one quilt per Show Society can be entered in this class.



Shows held after the RNA closing date for nominations may submit an entry form prior to their show judging in the name of the Show Society. Details of the entry may be forwarded with the quilt. Quilts judged in Shows after 21<sup>st</sup> July 2024 may be entered in the following year. Class 11 is an open class including both non-professional and professional.

Entries close 21st of June 2024. All posted quilts must reach the RNA by Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July or can be delivered on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> & Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> July. The quilts arrive quite early, but this early delivery is essential to allow for their safe storage and protection. As the Ekka's preparations progress, space becomes limited, and the area gradually transforms into a construction zone. The early date allows for the safe and convenient delivery of quilts, most of which are brought in by hand and competitors require parking. This schedule also ensures that there is adequate space for the judging process.

The EKKA takes the storage and handling of these quilts extremely seriously. When quilts are delivered, it is requested that each one be enclosed in a labelled, closable fabric bag (see schedule for guidelines). The judging takes place on the following day to minimise handling. The quilts are then placed into a dedicated crate, exclusively used for this purpose, and locked with a unique lock and key that only security possesses. These quilts are stored with great care until they can be transferred to the Upper RICC and hung for display.

It is essential that each quilt has a rod pocket attached to its back to help with hanging of the quilts., as detailed in the schedule.

#### What is Next Generation?

Next Gen are the Queensland Ag Shows youth steering committee whose aim is to advocate for and encourage young people within the show movement to celebrate the legacy and protect the vibrant future of local ag shows. Next Gen helps its members and affiliated Queensland Agricultural Shows either directly through contact with members at initiatives, and also indirectly from the flow on effects of providing assistance to the Queensland Agricultural Shows Board.

Next Gen is for young people between the ages of 18 and 35 within the Queensland Agricultural Show Movement

The Next Gen committee is involved in the Brisbane EKKA assisting in various State Final competitions. The Queensland Ag Shows Awards are an initiative of the Next Gen committee and are run, funded, and co-ordinated by them as well as organizing the annual Awards Gala Dinner.
