Companion Cards

We recently had an enquiry from a show about the rules surrounding Companion Cards and accessing free admission by a competitor for their carer. We have been provided with the following information from Card Services Qld.

Firstly, how our program works is the Companion Card program supports people who have a disability and a lifelong need for <u>attendant care support</u> to participate in community activities and attend venues. Companion Card holders receive a second 'companion' ticket at no charge at participating venues and on public transport. The 'companion' ticket is also exempt from booking fees.

 - can assist organisations and businesses to meet some obligations under anti-discrimination laws.
- 3. Businesses and organisations that affiliate with the scheme are provided with promotional materials, as well as an entry in the <u>searchable online database</u> used by cardholders.

Queensland Ag Shows Awards

Queensland Ag Shows Awards recognise excellence and innovation in the Agricultural Show movement.

It is time to start thinking who you will nominate for these awards!!

Outstanding Individual Contribution

This award aims to acknowledge individuals who have made a significant outstanding contribution or achievement within one of Queensland's 129 Agricultural Show Societies. They may have made a significant contribution during a 2023 Show or over a number of years in the capacity of a Chief Steward/Steward, exhibitor, organising volunteer or committee member etc, or to have assisted in an outstanding way through the development or organisation/running of a new or existing competition, secured considerable sponsorship or grant opportunities, or acted in a major role within the Show society that deserves recognition.

Emerging Leader

This award acknowledges an individual aged between 18 and 35 who has, through their attitude and efforts within at least one of Queensland's 129 Agricultural Show societies, demonstrated they are an emerging leader in the movement. Their work may have been to assist individuals or groups, or to develop competitions or programs to help the society and/or their community. For example, they might be a Steward, livestock donor, an organising volunteer, event marketer or executive member.

The nominee should have made a significant voluntary contribution to the benefit of the affiliated Show society. The nominee must be between the ages of 18 and 35 inclusive as at date of nomination and have been a member of a Qld Ag Shows affiliated Show for at least 12 months.

Best Innovation in A Local Event

This award is for innovation in a local event hosted by a Queensland Ag Shows affiliated show society. The award aims to not only celebrate the innovation, but those that helped to spearhead its organisation and development. The 'innovation' could include anything from a new entertainment item to innovative social media campaigns, data gathering and registration services, adaptations or any other innovation that has taken a local event experience to the next level. The innovation must have occurred during the *previous 12 months*.

How To Enter?

- Complete the details in the appropriate nomination form available on the website on the Awards page.
- Attach a maximum 1000-word submission outlining an overview of the nominee.
- Include a high-resolution photograph of the Nominee.

Nominations open in October and will close 31st December.

Other Queensland Ag Shows Awards

Queensland Ag Shows are invited to nominate supporters and members for the Friendship and Fellowship Awards and Meritorious Awards. Nominations can be made at any time throughout the year. Nominations are tabled at the Queensland Ag Shows Board meetings to be considered. While the board approves most nominations, it reserves the right to reject or defer any nomination submitted.

Friendship and Fellowship Award – This award is available to individuals or organizations not directly connected to the Queensland Show Movement who have contributed to the long-term success of Queensland Shows. Examples of past winners are judges, announcers, supporters.

Meritorious Award – A nominee must be a financial or honorary member of a Show Society.

A nominee must meet at least one of the following three additional requirements to qualify for nomination: -

- 1. Nominee to be currently actively involved in or recently secluded from participating in activities organised by a Show Society.
- 2. Nominee holds or has held an Executive position, a responsible Sectional position, or assisted in any capacity.
- 3. Nominee has made a significant voluntary contribution to benefit an affiliated Show Society.

Friendship and Fellowship Award

Averial Mahony was recently awarded the Friendship and Fellowship Award and was presented with her plaque at the recent Canungra Show by General Manager of Queensland Ag Shows, Trevor Beckingham.



Averial comes from a pioneer family in the Canungra District.

She has attended every Canungra Show since it commenced in 1937.

She has always exhibited in the Show cookery, needlework, and horticulture at the Canungra Show and Gold Coast Shows.

Averial is an exceptional cook and has won lots of sections throughout the years. She is still competing and last year she won the Champion Cut Bloom at the Canungra Show. Working with Children Blue Cards

Queensland Government

The blue card system is regulated by the Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000 (the Act).

Blue Card Services does not consider community show societies or their committee members to be engaged in employment or operating a business regulated by the Act. Not every environment where children are present requires a blue card. Community show societies, from the Ekka to a regional community show, are largely limited to organising short-term events open to the general public that are not captured by the blue card system.

Regarding whether adults working with volunteer students require a blue card, under the blue card system a person does not need a blue card if they are only giving help or guidance to a child as part of their employment or work experience. Therefore, a blue card is not required. Although blue cards aren't required for these activities, we encourage you to implement <u>risk management strategies</u> which will help to create a safe environment for children.

This advice is limited to the information and circumstances you have provided. If relevant information has not been considered or your circumstances change, please contact us for clarification about ongoing blue card requirements.

Trial Jumping Minimum Medical Requirements (MMR): September 1st - December 31st

As part of a nation-wide initiative, we would like to announce the introduction of a Jumping Minimum Medical Requirements (MMR) Trial, from September 1st until December 31st. During this period, we are asking all clubs and Organising Committees (OCs) to report the level of medical coverage they provide at their competitions compared to a trial set of MMRs. The goal is to gather clear and specific data regarding the cost, availability, and practicality of achieving a certain standard of medical response at our events.

Why the MMR Trial?

The trial introduces a target set of MMRs to serve as a benchmark. These are not yet final or mandated standards but are designed to give us something to aim for and gather valuable data. While some competitions may already meet or even exceed these MMRs, others may face challenges due to availability, cost, or other reasons. This trial will help us understand these challenges and collect data to inform future decisions.

What We Need from You

For each competition held during the trial period, we are asking OCs and clubs to report whether they can meet the MMRs or if they will need to seek a variation. If a variation is required, you will need to:

- Explain the reason for the variation (e.g., availability, cost).
- Provide the cost implications of meeting the recommended minimum standard.
- Specify the level of medical service that is actually provided at the event.

To simplify the process, each OC or club will be asked to complete a short form for each competition.

Required MMRs – Personnel & Vehicle/Equipment PERSONNEL

Applicability of the Trial

Please note that this trial only applies to competitive events where places are awarded, regardless of height (close or open). It does not apply to training days. Training days may include competitions with no prizemoney. If the event has prizemoney in any class it cannot be classified as a training day.

How to Report

The reporting process is straightforward. The form will first ask if your medical personnel and equipment comply with the MMR. If the answer is yes, no further questions are required. If the answer is no, you will be asked to specify the personnel and equipment you are providing and to quantify the availability, cost, or other issues that prevent your competition from meeting the MMRs.
